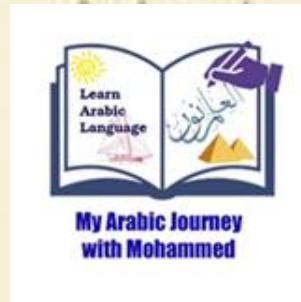


How to wish your friends Eid greetings in Arabic on Eid ul-Fitr.

happy and Happy New Year!



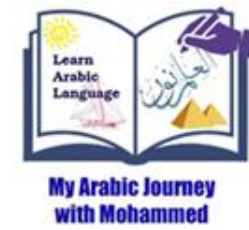

There are many ways to reply, but for now we will give you 3 examples that you can use to reply to anyone who greets you on Eid:

وَأَنْتُمْ بِخَيْرٍ.

Wa antom bi khairin.

And you are fine too.



You can reply like this:

عِيدٌ سَعِيدٌ عَلَيْنَا وَ عَلَيْكُمْ.

3īd sa3īd 3alainā wa 3alaikom.

Happy Eid to us and to you.
